Job Overview

Reporting to the Senior Project Manager, as the **Planning Project Manager** you will manage processes to support community development projects, from raw land acquisition through registration of subdivision plans.

Your day-to-day responsibilities will include:

- Leading the project team and managing consultants and contractors in the preparation and submission of area/neighborhood structure plans, zoning and subdivision applications and approvals.
- Participating in neighborhood/subdivision design and community visions/theming, in consultation with our project team.
- Managing the preparation of technical reports required at various stages of the land development process, including due diligence, planning, engineering and landscaping.
- Managing negotiation and preparation of both legal and informal land use documents required for subdivision registration (eg. survey plans, utility rights-of way, easements, agreements, registered documents, etc.).
- Fostering and maintaining strong working relationships with Administration, Council, Consultants, and industry in multiple municipalities. Attending meetings and functions and speaking at Council or other meetings during quasi-judicial hearings as required.
- Liaising with related parties, including external vendors, to provide information and project timeline updates.
- Monitoring day-to-day operations to ensure projects are carried out accordingly to standard processes and procedures.
